In to the Bible:

This week's sermon discussed the crowds encounter with Jesus shortly after he fed the 5000. In the text we see Jesus using physical examples to teach spiritual truths. Reread John 6:22-40 as group and discuss the following questions together.

Why was the crowd searching for Jesus now? What was their motive (v. 26)?

Restate what Jesus is teaching in verse 27, in your own words.

What does verse 28 reveal about people's search to please God?

What is the difference between every man-made religion and the teachings of Jesus (see verse 29)?

It is ironic that the crowd wanted to know what signs Jesus could give them that would compel them to believe - he just fed thousands out of almost nothing! What sign do you think would be enough to convince them?

What is the difference between the manna that Moses gave (through God) and the bread of God?

Does the response of the crowd in verse 34, show that they finally believed and accepted Jesus?

Share your thoughts on what it means that Jesus claimed to be "The Bread of Life".

What does it mean that those who go to Him do not hunger or thirst?

What is the will of God as shown in these verses?

Application Questions:



Why do many people follow Jesus these days?

Following Jesus for his benefits is not just a trap for the unsaved seeker, it can happen even in the life of a believer. What leads a follower of Christ to slip into the desire for benefits over the desire for Christ himself?
